Exhibit Drop–Off: Thursday July 13, 2017

Deliver your exhibit(s) to the Aldergrove Kinsmen Community Centre main hall on Thursday July 13, 2017 between 5:00 pm – 8:00 pm. Entries **MUST NOT** be removed before 3:00 pm on Sunday July 16, 2017. All entries **MUST** be picked up between 3:00 pm and 4:00 pm on Sunday July 16, 2017. Entries left after 4:00 pm on Sunday July 16, 2017 will be donated to charity.

NOTE: The Association reserves the right to reject or disqualify any entry that is objectionable or offensive in any way. All of your displays will be handled with care and attention; however, the Association is not responsible for any entries that are damaged, lost, or stolen during the Fair. Security will be present on the Fair Grounds and in the Exhibit Hall, but please leave valuable and irreplaceable items at home.

Prizes

If the entries merit such recognition, ribbons will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each class. Judging is based on the quality of the work, rather than number of entries per class. If the judges wish, they may award more than one first, second, or third place in a class if the entries warrant recognition. Prize ribbons awarded by the judges will be displayed on the entries for the duration of the Fair.

Division A – Baking & Canning

Open to Ages 19 & Over

Section Rules

1. NO store bought mixes.
2. Exhibitors may enter 1 to 3 different entries for each class.
3. All entries must have an attached label identifying the entry (e.g. 'Blueberry Muffins', 'Double Chocolate Cake', 'Canned Pears').
4. Place all baked goods on a disposable plate / tray of appropriate size, covered with a Ziploc-type bag. If the item has a soft or sticky topping, please cover with a clear plastic dome. A full decorated cake may be displayed on a suitable cake tray. PLEASE don't bring your best china or glassware!
5. All canned goods must be sealed in standard canning jars with new rings and lids. **Use 125 to 500 ml jars.** Rings must be loose, but seals not broken.
6. Canning entries may be made the year previous.
7. Sorry! Entries CANNOT be refrigerated. No whipped cream allowed on entries.

Note: Judges will sample your baking or open jars to taste your entry.



Section AB – Baking

See Rules 1, 2 & 3.

Class

1. Cupcakes, Decorated – 3 each, 1 cut in half
2. Squares, 1 Kind – 3 pieces, 1 cut in half
3. Muffins, 1 Kind – 3 of each, 1 cut in half
4. Cookies, 1 Kind – 3 of each, 1 cut in half

Section AC – Canning / Preserves / Condiments

Class

1. Canned Fruit – 1 jar
2. Canned Vegetable – 1 jar
3. Pickles – 1 jar
4. Jam – 1 jar
5. Jelly – 1 jar
6. Chutney, Salsa, Relish – 1 jar

Division B – Eggs

Open to All Ages

Section Rules

1. Eggs must be from fowl that are being raised by the Exhibitor.

Use egg cartons or a suitable size box to transport the eggs. If your chicken(s) has a name, please write it on the carton or box. Give the hen(s) some credit!

Label your entry B and include the Class #.

Class

1. Brown Chicken Eggs – 6 eggs (e.g. label 'B-1')
2. White Chicken Eggs – 6 eggs
3. Colourful Eggs, Any Variety – 6 eggs
4. Bantam Eggs – 4 eggs
5. Quail Eggs – 4 eggs
6. Duck Eggs – 2-4 eggs
7. Exotic Eggs – eggs from any other type of fowl, 1-2 eggs
8. Oddest Egg – oddest shaped, biggest or smallest egg, from any type of fowl (please note the type of bird) - 1 of each



Division C – Gardening

Open to All Ages

All plant entries must be owned by the Exhibitor for at least 1 month prior to the Fair.

Section C1 – Vegetable Basket Medley

Prepare a basket containing at least 4 kinds, up to 3 of each kind in basket. Label your entry C1.

Section C2 – Herb Bouquet, Fresh Only

Tie herbs in a neat bunch of 5 sprigs / blades and display in water. Please use a clear jar / bottle and attach a clearly printed label naming herbs. Label your entry C2.

Section C3 – Best Flower Hat

Creativity encouraged! Hat decorated with fruits and / or vegetables. Items that are silk, plastic, etc. are acceptable. At least one natural product must be included.

Section C4 – Cut Flowers

Class

1. Mixed Flowers Bouquet – may use both perennials and annuals
2. Roses Only Bouquet – 3-5 stems (1 or more kinds)
3. Most Fragrant Rose – looks don't count!

Display flowers in a container of appropriate size for the entry. Do not use valuable or irreplaceable containers, as breakage is possible and the Fair cannot be held responsible. Water the plant sufficiently for the duration of the Fair.

Section C5 – Outdoor Container Plants (Flowers or Shrubs)

Class

1. One Type of Plant Only – 1 basket / 1 pot
2. Mixed Container or Basket – containing 3 or more varieties of plants

Division D – Fine Arts

Open to Ages 19 & Over

Section Rules

1. All entries must be the original work of the Exhibitor, NOT copies of work by other artists.
2. Cover your name if you have signed your work.
3. You may enter 1 to 3 entries per class.

Section D1 – 2D Works of Art

State medium / method, e.g., charcoal, pastel, pencil; oil, acrylic, or watercolor paint; monotype, screen prints, zentangle ink, pencil etc. NOTE: ALL pictures MUST be securely wired and ready for hanging. Do not exceed 36" x 36" including the frame, if there is a frame.

Class

1. Representational Art – any medium
2. Abstract – any medium
3. Mixed Media

Section D2 – 3D Works of Art

Class

1. Pottery, Ceramics or Sculpture - any item decorative or functional
2. Collage / Fiber Wall Hanging

Division E – Needlework

Open to Ages 19 & Over

Section Rules

1. The Exhibitor must have made the items by hand.
2. If work bears a signature, cover or remove for judging.

Section E1 – Knitted or Crocheted Item

Any knitted or crocheted item.

Section E2 – Quilting, Any Item

Any quilted item.

Section E3 – Sewing

Class

1. Any Dress, Any Size
2. Any Other Article of Clothing, Any Size
3. Any Sewn Item

Section E4 – Needlework, Any Item

Any needlework class not listed above (embroidery, cross stitch, weaving, etc.).

Division F – Crafts

Open to All Ages

This section includes useful and decorative items made completely by hand or by using only simple tools. Crafts are judged on creativity, quality of work, and pleasing esthetics.

Section F1 – Shop Crafts

Class

1. Hand-Made of Wood – any functional item
2. Hand-Made of Wood – any decorative item
3. Hand-Made of Metal – any functional item
4. Hand-Made of Metal – any decorative item

Section F2 – Decorative General Hobbies

Class

1. Mason Jar Art
2. Scrapbooking – any themed scrapbook, cover should indicate theme, 1-3 entries
3. Special Occasion Handmade Card – e.g. Birthday, Baby Announcement, etc., 1 to 5 cards max
4. Special Holiday Card – 1 to 5 cards
5. Homemade Soap – 2 bars
6. Birdhouse

BCAAFE Members Choice Category #1 – Arts & Crafts (all ages)

THEME: “Red & White”

ITEM: Decorative Mason Jar (Quart Size)

Decorate a quart size mason jar on the “inside” with the colour theme of red and white. The jar must have a lid. Contents are optional.



BCAAFE Members Choice Category #2 – Arts & Crafts (all ages)

THEME: “Canada’s 150th Anniversary”

ITEM: Mug Rug (Maximum 4” X 7”)

Create one mug rug using any materials desired.



Section F3 – Flower Power

Class

1. Cake Decorating – decorate cupcakes or an 8” round cake with your best take on a groovy Flower Power theme!
2. Flower Pot – 7” pot planted with 3-5 annuals
3. Hippy Flower Hat – decorate a hat with flowers (can be a blend of real and artificial), 5 colours minimum



Section F4 – Fairy Garden

Class

1. Miniature Fairy Door – a small door shaped piece of wood, decorated with anything you might think a fairy would do to be welcoming; Remember the doorknob!
2. Miniature Fairy House – shoebox size or smaller
3. Miniature Fairy Garden – use natural materials Maximum size 8”X 10” garden pot, bucket or planter
4. Fairy Teacup Garden – Create an arrangement in the space of a teacup!



Division G – Photography

Open to Ages 19 & Over

Section Rules

1. All photography classes are open to both digital and 35 mm film photography.
2. All photos must be taken by the Exhibitor.
3. YOU MAY ENTER 1 TO 3 PHOTOGRAPHS PER CLASS #. There is no distinction between Novice and Advanced.
4. Photos may be either black & white or colour, unless otherwise specified.
5. Photo size: minimum 4" x 6", maximum 8" x 12".
6. Mount on white or black cardstock or poster board with a 1" border, as each will be pinned for display. If it's not mounted, it won't be displayed!
7. Panoramic photos to be 4"x 6" and must be mounted together
 1. on white or black cardstock or poster board with a 1" border around display. Photos not to exceed 18 inches joined (19" with border)
8. Attach a label to back of each entry listing Exhibitor's name, Division G and the Class #.
9. If necessary, use an arrow to indicate which way is up by marking the back of the photograph.
10. Entries considered offensive will not be allowed to compete or be displayed.
11. Permission must be obtained from any people in photographs before their images may be shown.

1. Black & White Print, Animals
2. Black & White Print, People
3. Black & White Print, Your Subject of Choice
4. Colour Print, Pets
5. Colour Print, Wild Animals
6. Colour Print, Flowers or Plants
7. Colour Print, Nature
8. Colour Print, Sports / Action / Special Event
9. Colour Print, Your Subject of Choice
10. Macro Photography, Black & White or Colour
11. Panoramic View – set of 3 to 5 photographs, any location, not to exceed 18" joined
12. Picture Story, Any Subject – set of 4 prints that tell a story; give your story a title

Category #3 – Photography in Sepia (all ages)

THEME: "Heritage Barns in BC"

Division K (Kids) – Open to Ages 6 to 12

Section K1 – Baking

Section T1 – Baking

Section Rules

1. NO store bought muffin, cake or cookie mixes.
2. Attach a label identifying the entry (e.g. 'Blueberry Muffins').
3. Place all baked goods on a disposable plate / tray of appropriate size, covered with a Ziploc-type bag. If the item has a soft or sticky topping, please cover with a clear plastic dome.
4. Is it HOT? Please supervise younger children.
5. Sorry! Entries CANNOT be refrigerated. No whipped cream allowed on entries.

Class #

1. Muffins – 1 kind, 3 each, one cut in half
2. Cupcakes – with or without icing, any kind; 3 each, one cut in half
3. Cookies – 1 kind, 3 each, one cut in half
4. Rice Cereal Squares – 2 each, plain or fancy



Section K2 – Vegetables & Fruits

Section T2 – Vegetables & Fruits

Vegetables should be clean, but not scrubbed. Vegetables may be grown in your greenhouse.

Class #

1. Vegetable and Fruit Basket – 4 kinds, up to 3 of each kind in basket
2. Fruit / Veggie / Nuts Creation – design and build a figure using only fruits, vegetables, and / or nuts. Items may be purchased or grown by the Exhibitor. May be fastened with wire, glue or toothpicks

Section K3 – Flowers & Plants

Section T3 – Flowers & Plants

NOTE: All plant entries must be owned by the Exhibitor or their family for at least 1 month prior to the Fair.

Display in a vase, jar, or can of appropriate size for the entry. Add enough water for 3 days.

Class #

1. Marigolds – 5 blooms, 1 kind
2. Largest Leaf – any kind
3. Bouquet – at least 3 kinds of flowers

Section K4 – Needlework

Section T4 – Needlework

Class #

1. Knitted or Crocheted Item – label as K4 or T4
2. Any Sewn Item

Section K5 – Works of Art

Section T5 – Works of Art

Must be the original work of the Exhibitor.

Do not exceed 30" x 30" including the border.

ALL pictures MUST be mounted on black or white paper with a 1" border so it can be mounted to the display boards.

Enter 1-3 items per Class.

Class #

1. Painting – any subject, any medium
2. Freehand Drawing – any subject, any medium
3. Zentangle Drawing – any pattern

Section K6 – Photography

Section T6 – Photography

1 to 3 entries per Class # allowed.

Permission must be obtained from persons in photos.

Mount photographs on white or black paper, cardstock or poster board with a 1" border.

Attach a label to back of each entry listing Exhibitor's name, Section, and Class #. If necessary, indicate with an arrow which way is up.

All prints to be no smaller than 4" x 6" and no larger than 8" x 12".

Picture story photos to be 4" x 6" and must be mounted together on white or black paper, cardstock or poster board with a 1" border around display.

4. Flowers or Plants
5. Pets
6. Wild Birds / Animals
7. Sports / Action / Special Event
8. Macro Photography – any subject
9. Your Subject of Choice

Section K7 – Crafts

Section T7 – Crafts

Class #

1. Scrapbook or Journal – any theme, made using photos, craft supplies etc.
2. Handmade Cards – for different occasions; enter up to 3 cards; must have protective covering
3. Beadwork – any variety, any item
4. LEGO Creation – no larger than 12" x 16", on a base and covered securely
5. Meccano, K'nex or Similar Building Toy Creation - no larger than 12" x 16", on a base and covered securely
6. Plastic Model – from kit or handmade
7. Metal Model – from kit or handmade
8. I Made It from Wood – e.g. birdhouse or bird feeder, from a kit or handmade; box; toy; any article
9. Diorama – or decorated shoe box

BCAAFE Member's Choice Category #2 – Arts & Crafts (children 12 & under)

ITEM: Mini Scarecrow

Recycle household materials to create a mini scarecrow to stake or hang in your garden. Wire and / or string can be used to construct your project.

SIZE: Maximum height 14"

Section K8 – Collections

Section T8 – Collections

Collections no larger than 24" x 24".

Arrange collections in a container or on a base.

Collections may be covered with clear wrap.

Please fasten all collection items securely.

While care will be taken to protect all entries, please leave valuable or breakable collections at home where they are safe.

Class #

1. Sports Team Collection
2. Animal Collection – mixed animals or one type only
3. Shell Collection
4. Rock Collection



Division P – Preschool

Open to Ages 5 & Under

Please note child's age on entry form. CHILD MUST DO MOST OF THE WORK, BUT MAY HAVE ASSISTANCE FROM A SUPERVISING ADULT OR OLDER YOUTH. PARENT OR GUARDIAN – PLEASE SIGN THE ENTRY FORM TOO.

Section P1 – Baking

Display on a disposable plate / tray of appropriate size and covered with a Ziploc-type bag.

Class

1. Rice Cereal Squares, Plain or Fancy – 2

Section P2 – Gardening

Vegetables should be clean, but not scrubbed.

Fruit – leave stems attached, do not polish.

Class

1. Little Basket – with 2-4 vegetables and / or fruit from your garden
2. Oddest Shaped Vegetable or Fruit
3. Marigolds – 5 blooms, 1 kind
4. Bouquet of Flowers – at least 3 kinds of flowers
5. Veggie FARMER! – use any vegetable or fruit material to create the best FARMER. Items may be grown by Exhibitor or purchased; wire, wood, plastic fasteners, and even glue are allowed

Section P3 – Works of Art

Artwork must be mounted on black or coloured paper with a 1" border for pinning to the display boards.

Class

1. Freehand Drawing – any subject, any medium
2. Coloured Picture – judged on colouring only, picture may be from a colouring book
3. Painting – with a brush, any subject
4. Finger Painting – any subject, can be abstract; use 2 or more colours
5. Foot Painting – use 2 or more colours

Section P4 – Crafts

Class

1. Scrapbook or Memory Page – any theme
2. Handmade Card
3. Collage – cutting and pasting
4. Sticker Page
5. LEGO Creation – any article, max. size 12" x 16", on a base or in a container

Section P5 – Collections

Collections no larger than 24" x 24".

All collections to be arranged in a container or on a base, and must be covered.

Please fasten all collection items securely.

While care will be taken to protect all entries, please leave valuable or breakable collections at home where they are safe.

Class

1. Toy Cars or Trucks Collection – 6 items
2. Doll Collection – please, no porcelain or breakable dolls
3. Toy Animals Collection
4. Rock Collection
5. Any Other Collection
